| Bosses | ALL bows will shoot on TenZone foam bosses |
| Places | 256 archer places available initially |
| Faces | Compounds will shoot on 80cm 6 ring faces for 50m Qualification and H2H's. Recurves (and other bows) will shoot on 122cm faces for 70m Qualification and H2H's |
| Bows | Compound and recurve – WA equipment rules apply Longbow and Barebow can shoot but in Recurve division |
| Prizes | Both days – men/women and compound/recurve (open to all archers who are members of Associations affiliated with World Archery). Top three in each class receive a permanent trophy |
